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### **CRYNODEB ARIANNOL 2020/21**

Cafodd gweithrediadau'r Cyngor eu heffeithio'n sylweddol yn ystod y flwyddyn gan y pandemig Covid; gostyngodd incwm o wasanaethau'r cyngor (megis defnyddio'r cae rygbi, hurio Neuadd Ddinesig San Pedr, ayyb) yn sylweddol. I ddigolledi am hyn, llwyddodd y Cyngor gael grantiau gan Lywodraeth Cymru (£13,308) a 'Gwobrau i Bawb' y Loteri Genedlaethol (£10,000) - a defnyddiwyd i ddarparu nifer o gyfleusterau a gwasanaethau a fu o gymorth i'r gymuned leol i ddelio gyda heriau'r pandemig. Fu cais prosiect partneriaeth am grant o £25,000 gan Lywodraeth Cymru tuag at brynu cyfleusterau bwyta allanol ger Castell Caerfyrddin hefyd yn llwyddiannus.

**Praesept y Cyngor** yw prif ffynhonnell incwm y Cyngor ac yn cynrychioli swm y dreth cyngor a delir gan aelwydydd yng Nghaerfyrddin sydd yn cael ei dyrannu i'r Cyngor Tref. Cododd y praesept blynyddol (£138.42 fesul aelwyd Band D) gyfanswm o £768,848 i'r Cyngor Tref yn ystod 2020/21 (nid yw'r Cyngor Tref yn derbyn unrhyw beth oddi wrth dreth busnesau). 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## FINANCIAL SUMMARY 2020/21

Council's operations during the year were significantly affected by the Covid pandemic; income from the sale of council services (such as the use of the rugby pitch, hire of St Peter's Civic Hall, etc) was significantly reduced. To compensate for this, the Council was successful in obtaining grants from Welsh Government (£13,308) and the National Lottery's 'Awards for All' (£10,000) – that were used to provide a number of facilities and services that assisted the local community deal with the challenges of the pandemic. A partnership project application for grant funding of £25,000 from Welsh Government towards the purchase of outdoor eating facilities near Carmarthen Castle was also successful.

The **Council Precept** is the main source of Council income and represents the amount of council tax paid by households in Carmarthen that is allocated to the Town Council. The annual precept (£138.42 per Band D household) raised a total of £768,848 for the Town Council during 2020/21 (the Town Council does not receive anything from business rates). It also received income from the provision of its services such as:

Carmarthen Cemetery: £58,277

Carmarthen Park Tea Shop: £14,709

Parks (including velodrome): £10,505

Other income received was £21,630 giving total income for 2020/21 of £922,277.

The Council retains **reserves** of £150,000 to deal with unforeseen contingencies and emergencies.

Expenditure on **capital projects** during 2020/21 was restricted by the pandemic but a number of projects were completed. These included:

- Repairs to the paths and drains in Carmarthen Park - £26,150
- Upgrade of the public toilets at Carmarthen Park - £14,830
- Maintenance and repairs to of the roof at St Peter's Civic Hall - £3,397.50
- Contribution towards the purchase of outdoor eating facilities at the castle forecourt, Nott Square (jointly funded by Welsh Government) - £4921.50

The challenges of the pandemic have been unique and significant - but this situation has presented the Town Council with many opportunities to serve the local communities differently - and the initiatives summarised above represented a big change to the Town Council's usual way of working. As a consequence, the Council's support for local communities and the leading role played by it in promoting the economic recovery of the town has resulted in many more people learning about the Council and helping to understand its role in supporting the people of Carmarthen.
What have been the barriers for the Council?	
Are there any matters the PSB could support delivery/progress on?	To continue to facilitate joint working and the sharing of good practice between members.
What are the Council's main priorities looking forward to 2021-22?	The Town Council will continue to support the town's economic recovery from the pandemic and will look to extend its support for voluntary organisations and those working with vulnerable people.

## Biodiversity Duty Report to Welsh Government

### *Environment (Wales) Act 2016 Part 1 - Section 6 Biodiversity and Resilience of Ecosystems Duty Report*

- The Council provides a range of local services and manages a number of green spaces. These include several public parks, play areas and Carmarthen Cemetery. A butterfly garden was created at Carmarthen Park during 2020 and wild flowers were also seeded on the banks of the velodrome.
- The Council published a 'Biodiversity and Environment Development Action Plan' in September 2018 and it also has a Council Sub-Committee - Sian Johnston Committee - which deals specifically with matters relating to the environment and sustainability. This makes recommendations to the Town Council on these matters.



## Appendix A: 5 Ways of Working

<b>Long Term</b> The importance of balancing short-term needs with the need to safeguard the ability to also meet long-term needs.
<b>Prevention</b> How acting to prevent problems occurring or getting worse may help public bodies meet their objectives.
<b>Integration</b> Considering how the public body's well-being objectives may impact upon each of the well-being goals, on their other objectives, or on the objectives of other public bodies.
<b>Collaboration</b> Acting in collaboration with any other person (or different parts of the body itself) that could help the body to meet its well-being objectives.
<b>Involvement</b> The importance of involving people with an interest in achieving the well-being goals and ensuring that those people reflect the diversity of the area which the body serves.

## Appendix B: National Well-being Goals

National Goal
<b>A Prosperous Wales:</b> An innovative, productive and low carbon society which recognises the limits of the Global environment and therefore uses resources efficiently and proportionately, and which develops a skilled and well-educated population in an economy which generates wealth and provides employment opportunities, allowing people to take advantage of the wealth generated through securing decent work.
<b>A Resilient Wales:</b> A nation which maintains and enhances a biodiverse natural environment with healthy functioning ecosystems that support social, economic and ecological resilience and the capacity to adapt to change.
<b>A Healthier Wales:</b> A society in which people's physical and mental well-being is maximised and in which choices and behaviours that benefit future health are understood
<b>A More Equal Wales:</b> A society that enables people to fulfil their potential no matter what their background or circumstances
<b>A Wales of Cohesive Communities:</b> Attractive, viable, safe and well-connected communities
<b>A Wales of Vibrant Culture and Thriving Welsh Language:</b> where we have lots of opportunities to do different things and where lots of people can speak Welsh
<b>A Globally Responsible Wales:</b> where we look after the Environment and think about other people around the World
