CHC – Who are we?

Community Health Councils (CHC) are the independent voice of people in Wales who use NHS services. We are made up of local volunteers who act as the eyes and ears of patients and the public.

There are 7 CHCs covering different parts of Wales.

We encourage and support people to have a voice in the design and delivery of NHS services.

We provide an important link between those who plan and deliver NHS services, those who inspect and regulate it and those who use it.

What do we do?

We:

- Consider health issues from the public's viewpoint
- Visit local services to hear from patients and those who care for and about them about their experiences
- Look at local and national NHS plans and proposals to make sure they meet the needs of local communities
- Meet regularly with NHS managers
- Speak to people in their communities about their views and experiences of the NHS services
- Provide a free, confidential and independent complaints advocacy service for people who want support to raise a concern about NHS care and treatment.
